## **GOD IS A WORKING GOD**

Read Genesis 2: 15

Given that God creates man from the dust of the earth, what do we learn about God's attitude to work, the material world, and ordinary life?



Noel Weeks in 'Gateway to the Old **Testament** writes...

We should not see chapters 1 and 2 as completely divorced from chapter 1. The new section begins at 2:4 with 'These are generations of the heavens and the earth.' The formula 'these are the generations of x' occurs a number of times in Genesis. It means 'these are what comes forth from x'; 'these are what are generated by x'. For example, generations of Terah are described from Genesis 11:27 to 25:11, but only a few verses mention Terah since the real subject is the what comes forth from Terah, that Abraham. So Genesis 2:4 is not concerned with retelling the story of the heavens and the earth. It focusses on what comes forth from the heavens and the earth, namely plants, animals and man. It presupposes chapter 1. There is a certain overlap, but chapters 2 and 3 cannot be regarded as a account creation that could stand alone.' p 86
