

That prayer within pain can be called a gift of God may not sound all that natural to some ears, but it is the heart of lament and one of the many responses that God has endorsed for his creatures. I spoke about my own background and experiences while trying to tell a story about the evidences of God's grace in my life. There were several tangents about French Huguenots and American geography, which I hope facilitated fellowship for those in attendance. In a similar spirit, the ScotsCity congregation has (re)started a book club, as we meet fortnightly on Sunday at 3:30 p.m. to discuss D.A. Carson's Praying with Paul. Anyone is also welcome to ScotsCity, our 5 p.m. service, where I've just started a sermon series on Luke's Gospel.

So we celebrate the high festival with joy of heart and delight, which the Lord radiates upon us, he himself is the sun, that through the splendor of his grace illuminates our hearts completely, the night of sin has disappeared Hallelujah!


#### **CANTATA SUNDAY**

# **BIBLE STUDY AND PRAYER GROUPS**


