Dear friends.



SCOTS' NEW CAR PARKING SYSTEM

As a reminder, we have transitioned to a new free parking system. Please follow the new system outlined below or our video tutorial: https://youtu.be/565O3e0hzFo.

Please note that free parking is only available on Sundays.

1. TAP YOUR CREDIT CARD WHEN YOU ENTER THE CARPARK

When you first arrive, tap your credit or debit card at the car park gate. You will not be charged.

2. OBTAIN YOUR VALIDATION RECEIPT



Before you leave the church, collect a validation receipt from the Welcome Desk.

3. SCAN THE VALIDATION RECEIPT AT THE CARPARK BOOM GATE



When you leave the carpark, <u>SCAN THE</u> <u>VALIDATION RECEIPT FIRST.</u>

4. TAP YOUR CREDIT CARD AT THE CARPARK BOOM GATE



AFTER YOU SCAN THE VALIDATION RECEIPT_tap the credit or debit card you used to enter. If the validation receipt has been scanned, you will not be charged.

Exit the car park as normal. If you have problems, use the call button on the unit to speak to an operator.
