It was Presbytery week again, and this time our regional ministers and representative elders met at our Flemington branch church. As part of the program on Wednesday night we heard a report from Justin Ang and our Flemington Assistant Minister Lindsay Kliendienst on the work of both the congregation and the Flemington Mission. Happily, Lindsay was able to report steady growth in areas over the past year. The news that six children will be baptised this Sunday left the Presbytery very encouraged! (Justin will be attending for this.)

This Sunday's bible passage from 1 Corinthians is full of strange sounding details about marriage, remarriage, betrothal and even slavery – but beneath it all is the radical principle of **contentment in your own situation**, because as Paul says (twice) **"You were bought with a price..."** – a reference to the Cross, where Jesus, in his death, ransomed us from guilt and the penalty of sin and judgment to live as freely forgiven followers of Jesus. In Paul's thinking, that changes everything, and gives every reason for contentment. Maybe we should try "Cross Centred Contentment" a bit more often! **Please join us on Sunday at 11am or 5pm as Arthur unpacks these ideas further.**

ROAD CLOSURES


There are a number of road closures that may affect your travel to Scots' this Sunday. Roads are expected to be reopened by Monday.


We look forward to seeing you at the Mission Partners Lunch on 9 March.
