From the Minister's Desk

Dear friends,

As you know, with the upcoming departure of **Jonathan North** from our admin team, our Staffing Committee has been hard at work this week as we interviewed a short list of excellent contenders. To be honest, we've been surprised at the fact we have had such high quality interest, with around 45 applicants, and a wide array of skills and experience.

We are hoping to finalise the process in the coming week.

It's been a full week, with **Tuesday** night small groups back in action, a Fellowship Luncheon with Douglas Lawrence on **Wednesday** and **Thursday's** LunchBreak service.

It's been my turn for medical adventures this week. On Monday evening I had what seems to have been a mild TIA ... if you've had one, you'll know the term! It's a Transient episode of stroke like symptoms - in my case, for a minute or two unable to find words. Within ten minutes we had walked to St Vincent's, and 30 minutes later I was in the CAT scanner.

I spent the night in hospital, had blood tests and various pokes and prods, demonstrated that I could recite the months of the year in reverse order and was discharged with aspirin and cholesterol medication. The discharge doctor was encouraging - the scans were all clear, but I will have an outpatient MRI in the next few weeks for a closer look. The new meds should minimise the risk of recurrence. Meanwhile I have been told to reduce my pace a little.

As it happens, we were already booked to take holidays for three weeks from next Wednesday. A few days medical leave this week will lead into that. My appreciation to **Justin Ang** who has stepped in to fill all the gaps at short notice. Thanks Justin!


Goods can be left either at the Welcome Desk or over at the Mezzanine floor of the Westpac building during Social Hour after Church.
